

**ORDINANCE 2012-E
OF THE
WHEELING PARK DISTRICT
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

**RE: DECLARATION OF SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY AND AUTHORIZATION
FOR SALE OR DISPOSAL**

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board of Commissioners of the Wheeling Park District it is no longer necessary or useful to, or in the best interest of, the Park District, to retain ownership of the personal property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, it is determined by the Board of Commissioners that such personal property is declared surplus, and shall be disposed of in the manner stipulated below; and

WHEREAS, at least three-fifths (3/5) of the Board of Commissioners of the Wheeling Park District finds that the said property is no longer necessary or useful to the Park District's current needs or operations and is thereby considered as surplus property, but that revenue acquired from its sale can be applied to the purchase of similar equipment or other materials needed by the Park District;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
OF THE WHEELING PARK DISTRICT, COOK AND LAKE COUNTIES, STATE OF
ILLINOIS** as follows:

SECTION 1: That pursuant to authority granted to the Park District under 70 ILCS 1205/8-22, the following described personal property now owned by the Wheeling Park District, is no longer necessary and useful to the Park District, and in the best interest of the Park District will be offered for sale by auction or sealed bid to be awarded to the highest bidder.

SECTION 2: The Wheeling Park District shall offer at auction all of the surplus personal property listed above at a time, place and manner beneficial to the Park District.

SECTION 3: Should any of the items listed above not be disposed of through auction, the Park District's Executive Director, or the Executive Director's designee, shall be authorized to dispose of such personal property in the manner deemed most economical and appropriate.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from, and after, its passage.


